For more than 30 years, WM has partnered with WHC (Wildlife Habitat Council) to enhance and protect thousands of acres to support sustainability programs, biodiversity initiatives and environmental education. By transforming land into certified wildlife habitats, WM is helping communities thrive. At Springhill Regional Landfill in Campbellton, Florida, employees actively manage conservation projects focused on mammals and other habitats. **The conservation program at Springhill Regional Landfill has been WHC-certified since 2006.**

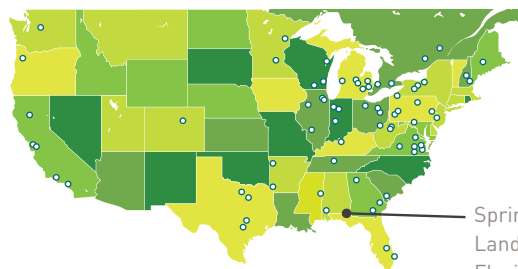
PRACTICES AND IMPACTS

- The team has created seven food plots for local wildlife to forage on, planting grass, corn and clover. These plots also serve as movement corridors for the wildlife.
- The team maintains the plots through mowing and re-seeding.
- The plots are monitored with camera traps and the team checks the plots to ensure sufficient food is available.
- Wildlife observed on-site include white-tailed deer, wild hogs and raccoons.
- Due to the success of the plots, the team is considering installing additional plots and cameras to attract more wildlife.
